

New Tax Compliance Report

How to find the IRS report in an Individual Online Account

What it is: The Tax Compliance Report (TCR) summarizes the result of an IRS tax check. It indicates whether the account appears compliant, non-compliant, or has a compliance issue.

Where to find it

- 1

Open your IRS Individual Online Account
Sign in to the account for the taxpayer whose compliance status you need to check.
- 2

Choose Records and status
Use the main account navigation to open the Records and status menu.
- 3

Open Tax records
Select the Tax records option labeled "View key tax filing information."
- 4

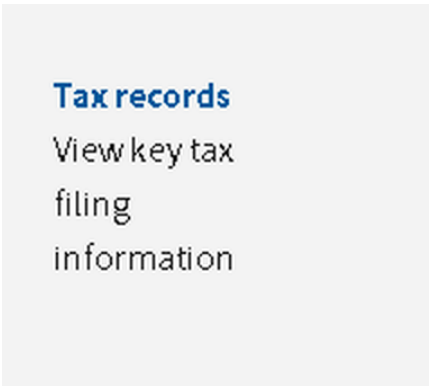
Request the tax check
In the Tax compliance report panel, request the check and download the resulting PDF.

Tax compliance report

The tax compliance report (TCR) will provide the result of a tax check. Use the TCR in lieu of a tax transcript to see whether you are compliant, non-compliant, or have a compliance issue.

To ensure compliance, timely file tax returns and pay all taxes as required.

Request a tax check to see if you are tax compliant.

What the screen says

Purpose	The TCR provides the result of a tax check.
When to use it	Use it in place of a transcript when you need to see whether the account is compliant, non-compliant, or has a compliance issue.
Maintaining compliance	File required tax returns on time and pay all required taxes when due.
Next action	Request the tax check, then select Download report (PDF) .

COMPLIANT

Amount you owe

IRS tax records do not show any unpaid federal income, employment, or excise tax debt.

IRS tax records show no late payments of federal income, employment, or excise taxes for the most recent four tax years.
